Greetings from the President's office. After a year as your President, and spending time in the corridors of power, I've come to understand what a great club we have. Did you know that our club has been around for over 30 years and maintains 40 km of classic, 11 km of skate, and 9 km of shoe show trails spread out over three great trail networks?



We can keep our membership costs low because of the great dedication of our volunteers. Over 200 members of our club have indicated a willingness to volunteer their time and expertise in every aspect of running the club. Our volunteers take care of everything from the maintenance of trail grooming equipment, trail building, hosting races, to running Jackrabbit Programs. Our club house, maintenance garage and other structures on our trail systems were all built with 100 percent volunteer labour.

Our Club has a very active youth program modelled under the National Jackrabbit Organization. Each year our program has over 80, 5-14 year old children. To run this program requires 20 trained coaches and 10 additional volunteers.

Youth skiing is also promoted through the four high schools and six elementary schools that use the club facilities for their programs. The Sawmill trail is also home to Georgian Bay Nordic our local competitive youth ski racing team.

It's been an eye opening experience to see the inner workings of a great organization. Lets keep it going for another 30 years!

Now back to business! Your executive have been busy over the past few months. One of our initiatives is to do a bit of a re-branding of the club, This involves coming up with a new club logo, renaming the Sawmill Trail to the Sawmill Nordic Centre, and new logos and signage at all three trails systems.

The goal of renaming the Sawmill Trail to the Sawmill Nordic Centre, is to recognize the fact that this facility has three trail systems (Skate, Classic and Snowshoe) and a warm-up hut. It was felt that many people unfamiliar with the trail, drive past not realizing what facilities exist on the site. With re-branding we are hoping that we can attract more day visitors and new members. A similar situation exists with the Rankin and Colpoy's Trails systems, these are great trail networks that have really poor signage. Unless you know specifically where these facilities are, you could drive right past them. The existing signage also does not mention that these facilities are operated by the Bruce Ski Club. It's going to take a few years to complete the re-branding exercise. In the end, we hope to generate more people usage of our trails.

Another area that we are really excited about, is that the our club is hosting the Ontario Masters Ski Championship from January 29-31, 2016. I would like to encourage all club members over the age of 35 to participate in this great weekend. I have participated in three Masters Championship in the past. I indicated that I "participated" and not "raced" because I can hardly be called a ski racer. I do it because it is a fun event and it gives me a training goal. It would be great if we had lots of club members "participating" in this fun event.

All the trails and grooming equipment are in great shape and ready for the start of the season. I would like to thank the record number of volunteers that came out for the trail clean up days. And a special thanks to our Trail Captains (Martin Kerr at Colpoys, Richard Bonert at Rankin and Fred Scheel at Sawmill). And thanks in advance to our dedicated team of groomers.

I would like to thank Suntrail Source for Adventure for again, hosting our club run ski exchange. This is a great event that enables people to get into the sport of skiing in an affordable way, it is also a fund-raiser for the club.

Please keep in mind that much of the land our ski trails are situated on are privately owned, and we are guests of the land owners. Without the generosity of these owners we would not have the great trail systems we enjoy today. Please stay on the trails and leave no trace except ski tracks.

Rankin Ski Trail

First a big Thank You to all the volunteers who helped with the new trail, the trail improvements at the lower Beattie Lake loop and the Fall trail clearing.

Skiing at the Rankin Trails gets even better this season.

The new Sky Lake loop in the south east has a length of 3.3 km. It removes the long 2.2 km entrance track from the Red Bay Road in the south. Just 1 km from the Red Bay Road and you reach that loop. You can ski that loop also from the Red Bay Lodge, it connects to the Fun Hill loop. Due to these changes, new trail maps have been posted throughout the system.

On weekends this winter, you can again have breakfast, lunch and dinner at the Rankin Trails at the newly renovated Restaurant and Bar "Tilted Antlerz" at the Red Bay Lodge. The new Restaurant and Bar is open Thursday and Friday 4:30 pm to 9 pm and Saturday and Sunday all day 8:30 am to 9 pm, see the ad in this newsletter.

As the Lodge is not open seven days a week, there will still be a port a-potty at the skier parking lot like last seasons. Parking for skiing will be the same as in the past, please do not use the parking for the Restaurant when you are skiing. Snow clearing for parking: The main access to the Rankin Trails at Red Bay Lodge will be plowed regularly by the BSC. This includes the parking lot for skiers at Red Bay Lodge and the access road to it.

The report is updated immediately after grooming by our groomer Peter, look at the date and time of the report and you get an immediate picture about the state of grooming at Rankin, before you set out for a drive to Red Bay.

I am Looking forward to even better skiing at the Rankin Ski Trail, and do not forget to check out the new facilities of the Red Bay Lodge.

Colpoys Ski Trail

A sunny and mild November Sunday saw eleven keen members turn out to help get the trails in order for the upcoming season, one couple drove from Mildmay! Thanks to you all.

Winter looks to be arriving a bit later this year and as this is written the last days of November show ground that is still soft and brown.

If you're new to skiing or to the area, here is what you might expect to happen at the trail in the next few weeks.

As the snow begins to accumulate expect there to be skiing at the Sawmill trail almost immediately, as the sandy base allows skiing and grooming with just a few inches of snow. Colpoys is a different beast and if you've never walked the trails when they are bare you may not realize how rocky it is on certain parts of the trail. In other words we need lots of snow before we can begin grooming without breaking equipment. I'd say at least 18 inches is required and closer to 24" to groom Ron's trail. The Rankin Trail also requires more snow than Sawmill but sometimes gets going before Colpoys.

Most people enter the trail system by heading east through the field to the gates and continue on to the Beaver pond loop or up Bert's boulevard. If the wind is really blowing an alternate entry can be made by going north and taking the short crossing of the fields and onto the trail system that way.

This year we will endeavour to keep the trails trackset as much as possible (and it's not always possible!), when the weather and conditions allow. Usually grooming begins by 8 a.m. and is complete by 10:30. The track in the exposed parts of the field will sometime blow in quickly but in the woods tracks are longer lasting. We try to keep the conditions posted on the website up to date so please check before you head out for updated trail conditions.
