Your Executive have been busy in the off season planning events, making trail improvements, formulating fund raising strategies and implementing a new streamlined registration process.

On behalf of the club I would like to extend my sincere thanks to Reg and Barbara for their many years of service to the club.

The new membership fees are Single Member \$80.00 (early bird \$65) Family Membership \$180 (early bird \$150). Day use fees will be \$8.00 for an adult and \$2.00 for a child under 13. We are encouraging all members to renew their memberships through Zone4.ca this year. It only takes a few minutes to register and you will save the cost of a stamp, envelope and trip to the post office. Please make sure you register before the early bird deadline on Nov. 20.

The goal in increasing the fees, is to increase the club's revenue sufficiently to set aside a minimum of \$10,000 a year in reserves, for the purchase and maintenance of grooming equipment. In this regard, our existing groomer at the Sawmill Trail is over 35 years old and will need to be replaced in the next couple of years. The cost of a comparable replacement is \$300,000. At the AGM a Fund Raising Committee was established to explore grant opportunities and to lay out fund raising strategies. More on this committee activities will be reported in future newsletters. When you renew your membership for the coming year we encourage you to make a donation towards

the purchase of a new groomer.

The Bruce Ski Club operates the most affordable, accessible and best maintained trails in Ontario. We accomplish this because of the strength of our volunteers. Thanks to everyone who helps out, regardless of how small or large your contribution, you make the club happen.

Rankin Trail at Red Bay

The trails are in good shape and are waiting for the annual trail work, which should be straight forward and is planned for Saturday the 14th November, details see later on the website under Rankin Trails. Two big changes will make skiing at the Rankin Trails even better this season.

1. There is a new loop which is in the south east. The new loop is the Sky Lake loop and has a length of 3.3 km. The south access from Red Bay Road reaches this loop after 1 km. The northern section of the old south access trail together with 1.9 km of new cut trail form the new loop.

A new better map will be posted throughout the system and on the website.



A big thank you to all the volunteers who came out in the last 2 months on several work parties to make the new loop happen.

2. The Red Bay Lodge which has been fully renovated opened last May and has a fully renovated large restaurant which will be open on the weekend during the winter, details should be on their website.

The new owner of the Red Bay Lodge, like last year, supports the BSC and the way we run the Rankin Trails at Red Bay, a big thank you to him.

As the Lodge is not open seven days a week, there will still be a porta-potty at the skier parking lot like last seasons. Snow clearing for parking : The main access to the Rankin Trails at Red Bay Lodge will be plowed regularly. This includes the parking lot for skiers at Red Bay Lodge and the access road to it.

Grooming? We groom typically twice a week, Fridays or Saturday a early morning for the weekend and in the beginning of the week Mondays or Tuesdays. We groom extra after really big snowfalls. If you want to know the state of grooming before you come out to the Rankin Trails at Red Bay, check our website www.bruceskiclub.ca . The report is updated immediately after grooming by our groomer Peter, look at the date and time of the report and you get an immediate picture about the state of grooming at Rankin, before you set out for a drive to Red Bay.
