Hello again and welcome to another interesting ski season. We have a new trail. Bruce Ski Club is pleased to partner with Bruce County, the Municipality of Northern Bruce Peninsula, and the Peninsula Adventure Sports Association to launch trail facilities at the Lindsay Tract! 4-5 km of trails will be open in the first year including a dedicated skijoring (ski with your dog!) loop.

The Lindsay Tract is an 8,000 acre forest that is owned and managed by the County of Bruce. The trailhead is just 10 minutes north of Lions Head on the west side of Highway 6. Stay tuned and check http://bruceskiclub.ca/lindsay-tract for more information about volunteer trail clearing days and opening.

This means that your membership/day use fee now gives you access to four great Bruce Ski Club trail systems.

Rankin Trail at Red Bay

I hope every one had a great summer - with this good summer weather! Lets hope for a great cross country skiing winter at the Rankin Trail at Red Bay.

The trails are generally in good shape, but little improvements can help increase the skiing experience. Last year we did some small reroutes to take out some sharp corners and a wet spot. This year we are planning to go after some notorious "wet spots", these are areas which are slow in freezing over or thawing early and therefore restrict skiing, if the winter is as unsteady as we had it in the past years.

We will have some small work parties in the coming weeks, for which I will email the Rankin volunteers. We are planning a general Trail Work Party for Saturday, 16th November 9:30 to 12:30, we will meet at the Red Bay Lodge.

The main trail access with parking will be the Red Bay Lodge (skier parking) again. The access to the parking lot will be ploughed regularly.

Grooming is typically before and after the weekend and after heavy snow falls, look up our trail report on the Bruce Ski Club website before heading out for a longer drive to the Rankin Trail. We update the trail reports immediately after each grooming, look at the date of the posting and you know the state of the trails and when we groomed the last time.

Maps are posted throughout the system, but if you would like to have one in your pocket go to the Club website, click 'Trails' then click 'Map'.

Fun Again this Year

We plan the 4th "Geo-Caching at the Rankin Trail at Red Bay" - it was a lot of fun last season! Look for details in the 2nd news letter and on the Club's website, but you can already mark your calendar for: Sunday the 23rd of February at 13:30. 
