Hello, fellow cross country ski enthusiasts. Another ski season is rapidly approaching, and it's time to get excited about it. Looking ahead to this coming season, our club is in great shape. Our membership is strong, sitting at 1300 members; we have a healthy bank balance, and a team of dedicated volun-



teers. Here is a quick summary of what we have been up to in the off season and looking ahead:

New Trail Expansion

We have really exciting news! For the first time in over 10 years we have expanded our trail system. A dedicated team of volunteers headed up by Dave White, have been working to expand our trail system onto the closed landfill site of Georgian Bluff. The trail is approximately 1.3 km long and has terrain similar to the Paper Clip Loop. I would like to thank Dave and all his team for the many hours they put in to make this a reality. We would also like to thank the municipality of Georgian Bluffs for allowing us access to this property for trail expansion.

New Jackrabbits Storage:

Jackrabbits now have a new area for storage. The back left-hand corner of Gerry's place has been filled in and will now provide a good home for Jackrabbit equipment.

I would like to thank Scott Turnbull, Dana Benson, and Joe Slade for their help creating an 8-inch extension/footing on the pad. One cement mixer and 30 jugs of water later we had a good place to build a wall. I would like to thank Brad Churchley for his leadership and skill in completing the enclosure. The supplies needed





to complete the storage area were donated in memory of Peter Day, an avid skier and frequent user of the Sawmill Trail, through the Southampton Rotary Club.

The completion of the Jackrabbits storage marks the final end to the propane heater that has rattled away for many years in the shelter. The exhaust from the heater does not belong in the new storage unit. After some deliberation, the decision has been made to use simple baseboard electric heat to replace the propane heater. A more ef-

ficient heat pump was considered but was deemed to lack the punch needed to overcome the demands placed on this space. All should be in place by the end of October.

The date for our annual trail cleaning day is Saturday, November 4th starting at 10:00 a.m. in the main parking lot, rain or shine. This is the same day as the Suntrail Ski Swap. There is a need for more shovels and pruners than usual this year. Our new section of trail on the old dump property has numerous small roots that need to be removed. In the spring of 2023, Canada lost an amazing athlete and coach. With John Gamble's passing the Owen Sound and Bruce Peninsula Community were profoundly saddened but grateful for the service that John had provided to sport during his time here as a coach and as a teacher. In addition, his wife Yolanda, also an excellent athlete and coach served both as assistant and Head Coach to the Georgian Bay Nordic.

In recognition of their exceptional contribution to the nordic ski community, GBN has established, through Nordiq Canada, a bursary in John and Yolanda's name. The intent of this Bursary is both to recognize outstanding achievement in Nordic Skiing competition and to ease some of the financial burden skiing and competing at this level demands. We also hope

that the offering of these Bursaries will help to inspire our young athletes to set and achieve outstanding High Performance goals. The \$500 Bursary will be awarded to GBN athletes who achieve top five places at Ontario Cup races then go on to compete at Canadian Nordic Nationals.


An additional \$500 Bursary will be awarded to GBN athletes who are selected, and go on to compete at U23 World Ju-
